RESTORATIVE DISCIPLINE – Dr Anthea Cereseto (3 sessions)

Consider the following questions

- Are you happy with the discipline at your school?
- Are parents and learners happy with the discipline at your school?
- Are teachers happy with the discipline in their classrooms?
- Does everyone in the school feel welcome?

It is unlikely that all these answers are a resounding YES.

Restorative discipline (RD) and restorative practices (RPs) provide an alternative to traditional discipline. Discipline or classroom management programmes including “Assertive discipline”, “Positive discipline”, “Cooperative discipline” and most others are adult-centred. They present ways for the adult to maintain control with, for example, threats, punishment, coercion, persuasion, bribery, positive reinforcement, and seemingly more child-friendly “choices” and consequences.

Restorative discipline, on the other hand, if implemented in totality is:
